## A Year in Review

#### **Professional Development**

The Professional Development team is dedicated to providing students the opportunity to interact with corporations and busines leaders, with the purpose of preparing them for a professional career. In 2019-2020, the PD team offered the first ever Sapphire alumni mentorship pairings and created a mock career fair using upperclassmen as recruiters.

#### Leadership Development

Leadership Development is a core component of the Sapphire program, both in the classroom and through events hosted by the Leadership Team. During the academic year, a small group of Sapphires had the opportunity to spend a weekend at Quantico studying decision making tactics in high stress environments. Additionally, Sapphire hosted its first global perspectives panel, focusing on the leadership and business differences across the world.

#### Communications

The Communications team worked diligently throughout the academic year to improve the internal efficiency of the Sapphire program. Specifically, the team was a driving force behind the smooth transition to a virtual environment, ensuring strong communication with the Sapphire students regarding the points system and upcoming events.

#### **Community Involvement**

The Community Involvement pillar is divided between two teams: Community Service and Sapphire Involvement. The organization is not only focused on giving back to the broader Penn State community, but also ensuring strong bonding across our Sapphire cohorts. During Fall of 2019, the Community Service team partnered with organizations such as the American Red Cross to promote blood drives and 5K races. Furthermore, Sapphire Involvement revamped the Lead & Leadle mentorship program, pairing incoming first-year students with upperclassmen to grow as leaders and create connections across Smeal.

#### Sapphire THON

Sapphire THON was able to see their fundraising efforts culminate in February during the 46-hour dance marathon, raising \$11,614.49! The most popular event was Sapphire's first annual Bingo Night with Dr. Novack, raising \$345!




